BEFORE YOU GO TO THE RACE TRACK ...


 This information will be extremely important in the event of an accident or medical emergency. Include any special medical or personal information you would want the emergency provider to know, or special contact information.

 Remember to sign and date the form and update when needed and/or annually.

 Make sure to notify the individual listed as your emergency contact and provide them with your primary health insurance information. Keep in mind that the race track event insurance is a secondary payer to your primary insurance coverage; therefore, you will need to provide the emergency treatment facility with your primary health insurance billing information.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO AT THE TRACK ...

 If transport to a medical facility is required, make sure that your emergency contact retrieves your driver's license from the Transponder Official at the race track. If appropriate identification is not provided with the patient when they arrive at the emergency care facility, the patient will be admitted using a pseudonym (i.e., a name made-up by admissions staff) so that emergency care can be provided without delay.

 Make sure that any items of clothing or safety equipment that are removed during driver extraction from the race car are given directly to the emergency contact responsible for the driver, particularly the driver's helmet! It is not unusual for those items to be passed around among crew members and fellow drivers, who may not understand the significance of taking these items to the emergency room so the medical providers can better assess the injury.
